OMI Sets All-Time Application Record

OMI Runs High-Impact Maternal and Infant Health Symposium in Kyrgyzstan

Could you find Kyrgyzstan on an unlabeled map? Kyrgyzstan is a sovereign state in Central Asia, with a population of 6.7 million. Bordered by Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, and China, it is a landlocked, lower middle-income country, which gained independence from the Soviet Union in 1991. Maternal, newborn, and child health are key indicators of health system performance, and despite major efforts to reduce mortality rates, mothers and newborns are still dying there in appalling numbers. From May 22 to 23, 2023, the OMI held a Maternal and Infant Health symposium at the Kyrgyz State Medical Academy in Bishkek. Neonatology pioneers Dr. Richard A. Polin (Columbia University) and Dr. Josef Neu (University of Florida) teamed up with gynecologist Dr. Petra Kohlberger (Medical University of Vienna) to share their expertise with 56 pediatricians, gynecologists, and obstetricians from the region.



OMI Faculty Teaches the Unteachable in Estonia

From May 24 to 25, 2023, OMI fellow Dr. Gerhard Grents invited OMI faculty Dr. Nancy Weigle and Dr. Jonathan E. Fischer from Duke University Department of Family Medicine and Community Health to participate in the first International Medical Education Conference "Teaching the Unteachable" at the University of Tartu, Estonia. The two-day conference focused on structuring learning and teaching skills in various medical education environments, with a particular emphasis on teaching communication and employing simulated patients. Drs. Weigle and Fischer then took part in the Spring School of the Young Family Doctors of Estonia, where they lectured and conducted workshops on deprescribing, sharing serious news, and physician wellness. They were also treated to a traditional Estonian smoke sauna to relax at the end of a busy day of teaching!



OMI Advances Palliative Care in Albania

An old saying goes, "Give a man a fish, and you feed him for a day. Teach a man to fish, and you feed him for a lifetime." The OMI's mission is to give fellows the empowering tools they need to steer their lives and impact the lives of many others. After attending the OMI Palliative Care and Nursing seminar in Salzburg, OMI fellow Irena Laska proposed replicating the course for colleagues in Albania. As Executive Director of the Mary Potter Hospice in Korce, her passion has been to advance palliative care throughout the country. She knew that to meet this goal, she would need to provide education for doctors, nurses, and instructors who will ultimately prepare the next generation of practitioners. To that end, Irena organized a three-day symposium in May of 2023. OMI faculty members Patrick Coyne and Carrie Cormack (Medical University of South Carolina), and Dr. Judith Paice (Northwestern University) led the teaching effort. 53 attendees were actively engaged and described the conference as highly transformative.

Sometimes life puts you in tough situations. Since civil war erupted in Sudan in April of 2023, OMI fellow Dr. MohammedElhassan M. A. Abdalla could not return to Khartoum after participating in the OMI Clinical Research Methods seminar. OMI Signs Partnership with Nigerian Teaching Hospital

We are taking another step forward in Africa! On May 16, 2023, the OMI signed a partnership agreement with the Obafemi Awolowo University Teaching Hospitals Complex (OAUTHC) located in Ile-Ife, Osun State, Nigeria. Affiliated with the Obafemi Awolowo University, OAUTHC is one of the leading teaching hospitals in the country. It provides comprehensive medical services through six clinics and offers a variety of educational and training programs. To ensure the operation runs smoothly, Dr. Adekunle Adeyemo, an ENT specialist and OMI alumnus, will assume the role of an OMI ambassador at the OAUTHC. So far, the OMI has awarded 96 fellowships to Nigerian physicians, 35 of them coming from Ile-Ife.
