2023 is a special year for the Open Medical Institute as it marks the program's 30th anniversary. When Drs. Wolfgang Aulitzky and Stephen Scheidt organized the first seminar in cardiology in 1993, they could not have foreseen the OMI's tremendous growth. From one to more than 40 seminars per year, the OMI has awarded over 27,600 fellowships to physicians from 132 countries. We have gone global with hubs in Mexico and Vietnam, in addition to Salzburg. This year alone, we trained 1,786 doctors at our three centers and received an all-time high of more than 9,500 applications. We are so grateful to you for being part of our first 30 years – here's to the next 30!

# **Learning to Be a Public Health Strategist**

At the beginning of December, the OMI, in collaboration with Maastricht University, kicked-off its first public health strategy seminar. A multidisciplinary faculty introduced participants to the essentials of public health with a focus on applying three lenses - law, systems thinking, and leadership - to devise strategies to improve population health in their home countries. Guided by the experts, the fellows identified public health issues that they would like to address and began shaping policy solutions that they will refine after returning home. In June 2024, the same cohort will reconvene at Schloss Arenberg for the next stage of the course.



# Mission Accomplished: OMI MEX Concludes 12th Seminar

Colorful Oaxaca was the location for our 12th and last OMI MEX seminar this year. Top experts, from the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Weill Cornell Medicine, Columbia University, Duke University, Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, and the Institut Pasteur, provided the academic leadership for the three-day courses in Mexico. 340 doctors from Latin America learned the latest information in pediatrics and adult medicine. We are successfully increasing the number of seminars offered in our second hub: Last year we had 11, this year we had a dozen, and next year there will be 13. We cannot wait to see what the future of OMI MEX holds!



Knee, Hip, Spine: Honoring Milestones of Orthopedics

Every year, the OMI, the Medical University of Vienna, and the Josephinum Medical History Museum jointly organize the Vienna School of Medicine Gala. At the event, held on October 16, 2023, renowned experts gave the 170 guests a glimpse into the fascinating world of orthopedics. Dean Dr. Markus Müller portrayed the era of artificial intelligence and digital medicine. Dr. Renate Kain, the OMI pathology co-course director, was presented with the 2023 OMI award. The evening raised EUR 70,000 in support of the three medical institutions.
